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POSTER SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Poster submissions must be e-mailed to: icmlekgotla@environment.gov.za

You should keep all emails sent to you regarding your poster submission. Once you submit, some specific background questions will be asked. The reviewers can see your answer to these questions. Once you have made your submission, you can opt to edit and re-submit until the closing date for submissions.

- 1. Abstract and Poster submissions close on: Friday, 16th August 2019
- 2. Poster Considerations:

A poster presentation allows a presenter to provide a visual summary of their research and/or innovation to be displayed for sharing with conference delegates. There will be dedicated time allocated in the conference program for poster viewing by delegates and also an opportunity for poster presenters to be available to discuss their work with conference delegates on an individual basis. A poster should be self-contained and self-explanatory, allowing different viewers to proceed on their own while the author is free to supplement or discuss particular points raised in enquiry. Posters will be selected for presentation by the Project Steering Committee by a double-blind peer review process. Abstracts submitted for consideration of a Poster Presentation should use the following criteria:

- Identification of relevant conference theme(s) to which submitted (see section 3 below).
- Written in English. Font: Times New Roman, size 10; Harvard Reference style.
- The title should be as brief as possible but long enough to indicate clearly the nature of the study. Capitalise the first letter of each word (except conjunctions). No full stop at the end.
- An Abstract of between 300-400 words (plus between 2-5 references to support the
 evidence -base of the abstract content). (Any abstract that exceeds the required word
 count will not enter the review process).





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- The Abstract is required to include details of either research, development and/or innovation, with sufficient information to enable the review panel to make a decision on appropriateness for Poster presentation in theme and context of conference.
- Abstracts should state briefly and clearly the purpose, methods, results and conclusions/discussions of the work.

3. Posters are invited to be submitted under one of the following categories:

- 1. GOVERNANCE & SCIENCE TO POLICY
- 2. ICM EXPERIENCES AND KNOWLEDGE/SCIENCE REQUIREMENTS
- 3. COASTAL AND OFFSHORE PLANNING
- 4. THE OPPORTUNITY OF INFORMATION SYSTEMS TO DELIVER ICM TOOLS AND KNOWLEDGE PLATFORMS
- 5. FUTURE-PROOFING ICM WHAT IS THE SCIENCE POINTING TO?

4. Maximum text length allowed is 300 words in length including sub-headings.

To assist your preparation, abstracts for posters may be structured under the sub-headings:

- Introduction/Background
- Aims:
- Methods:
- Results; and
- Conclusions.


The sub-headings must be concise, with only the first word starting with a capital letter.

- 5. Most of the submitted abstracts will be allocated posters as there will only be a limited number of slots for oral presentations. The best posters will be selected for specific poster presentation sessions with a discussant.
- 8. Posters should be designed in an A0 size. All selected poster presenters will be required to print out their approved posters at their own cost. Exhibition space for posters will be provided by the Lekgotla Secretariat.
