

VACANCY – FIELD ASSISTANT

Shark Spotters is looking for a flexible, diligent and methodical field assistant to collect data for a new project assessing the key variables that affect a shark spotter's ability to detect sharks in the inshore zone, in partnership with the Institute for Communities and Wildlife, University of Cape Town and Department of Science and Technology/Eurostars programme.

Field work includes working outdoors on the mountain for extended period of times as well as on a small boat. Candidates will need to be comfortable working in the elements with limited amenities.

This is a great opportunity for a young graduate to gain valuable field experience working on a novel and exciting project with a vibrant and enthusiastic team.

General Responsibilities

- Preparation and maintenance of equipment required for experiments
- Coordination of work schedule in accordance with weather/field conditions
- Coordination of in-field team for data collection
- Accurate collection and recording of data from field trials
- Data entry
- Communication and liaison with the public and beach stakeholders

- Demonstratable experience of data collection in the field
- Computer literacy
- Own transport essential
- Highly organized and efficient

Contract period: The successful candidate must start as soon as possible. The minimum contract period will be 6 months, from 1 February to 31 July 2019.

Hours and location of work: This is a part time position, however candidates will need to have flexible availability as the hours will be dependent upon weather/field conditions and may include weekends and public holidays where necessary. Field work will be based in Fish Hoek and Muizenberg, Cape Town.

Remuneration: Dependent on qualifications and in line with standard University of Cape Town remuneration rates for research assistants.
