Dr Anne Lemahieu: "The Algoa Bay Marine Spatial Planning Project: Who, What and How", will focus on Algoa Bay in particular, presenting a map of all the human uses of the Bay, the economic value of ecological services of the Bay and how Bay residents can get involved.

Dr Nina Rivers is a marine anthropologist investigating how to develop a collaborative marine spatial plan (MSP) for Algoa Bay. She is currently a postdoctoral research fellow with the Institute for Coastal and Marine Research (CMR) and the Department of Development Studies at Nelson Mandela University. Her research interests include knowledge integration, especially Indigenous and local knowledge, in ocean and coastal governance as well as stakeholder engagement processes in area-based ocean management approaches such as marine spatial planning. She has also consulted on jobs developing marine spatial plans for countries in the broader Western Indian Ocean Region.

Dr Anne Lemahieu is a geographer with expertise on Reunionese Marine Protected Area and interest in working on transdisciplinary projects to the service of a sustainable, equitable and inclusive ocean management. She is based in South Africa since 2015 and currently a postdoctoral research fellow with the Institute for Coastal and Marine Research (CMR).
